The Colonies Under British Rule Historian Pauline Maier : "The British colonists saw the year 1763 as a great watershed in American history. In the past, a great semi-circle of "Catholic enemies" had hemmed them in from French Canada and Louisiana on their north and west to Spanish Florida in the south.

The Colonies Under British Rule

These colonies were put under control of a Royal governor the king appointed and kept close to the government in the UK. Eventually, all thirteen colonies came to be controlled by a Royal governor. When they came to America, British settlers had no intention of turning their colonies into democracies.

The British also created "divide and rule" policies, pitting Hindu and Muslim Indians against one another. In 1905, the colonial government divided Bengal into Hindu and Muslim sections; this division was revoked after strong protests. Britain also encouraged the formation of the Muslim League of India in 1907.

Jamaica - British rule: In 1655 a British expedition under Admiral Sir William Penn and General Robert Venables captured Jamaica and began expelling the Spanish, a task that was accomplished within five years.
